Author Guidelines

1. The journal publishes academic articles, which are the work solely of the author(s) and has not been published before, or submitted to any other publication at the same time.
2. The journal publishes in both English and Somali languages in a clear and correct style. The use of either American or British English is acceptable, as long as consistency is maintained.
3. The manuscript should follow the academic standards with an appropriate methodology for each discipline. Citations and references can be in any style as long as consistency is maintained throughout the manuscript.
4. The manuscript should not violate any copyright or intellectual property rights, and must be free from plagiarism. Ensuring this is the sole responsibility of the author(s).
5. The manuscript must be written with Microsoft Word, font Times New Roman size 12. All manuscripts must be submitted electronically.
6. The recommended length for an article is 5,000–10,000 words, with an abstract of 150 to 200 words and around five keywords.
7. The submission begins with an abstract and the author's biography with full contact details, and can be done at any time. Early submission is highly appreciated.
8. The manuscripts undergo initial evaluation by the editors. Suitable papers are then peer reviewed by two or more anonymous reviewers, and only approved papers will be published.
9. If any changes are proposed, the author will be requested to make the necessary modifications. Minor adjustments may be made by the editors with notification to the author.
10. The journal publishes book reviews on newly printed books, and also publishes the abstracts of theses and dissertations in its scope.
11. After publication, both the journal and the author retain a full right to reuse the paper in any form, with acknowledgement of the original publication.
12. A symbolic honorarium is paid to the author(s) for each published article or essay as a token of gratitude for their contribution.
